Objectives:

Due to the nuclear accident at the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant of Tokyo Electric Power Company in March 2011, Yamakiya district has become the only evacuation area in Kawamata Town for 6 years. On 31 March 2017, the evacuation order was lifted, however, many challenges still remain. Life infrastructure, agricultural production, temporary storage facility, and acceleration aging populations are remaining challenges after returning from evacuation.

Under such circumstances, the returning residents do not know each other's activities well yet even in the same district. In this Dialogue Seminar, we will share the diverse situations of Yamakiya and provide an opportunity to discuss the future of Yamakiya.
