Dr. Werner Rühm



Werner Rühm (Germany) has been a member of Committee 1 since 2005. After training in physics, he started his research career at the Federal Office for Radiation Protection, Germany, in radioecology and in-vivo counting. When working at the Radiobiological Institute, University of Munich, concentrated on neutron dosimetry of the a-bomb survivors. He has served as a consultant for the ICRU and the US National Academy of Sciences, and received the Japanese Government Research Award in 1997. More recently, he joined the Helmholtz Center Munich and is currently leading the Individual Dosimetry Group of the Institute of Radiation Protection. He is professor at the Medical Faculty of the University of Munich, member of the Committee of Radiation

Risk of the German Radiation Protection Commission since 2003, and serving as Editor-in-Chief of the Radiation and Environmental Biophysics journal since 2005. Since 2010 he is EURADOS Council member, and since 2011 he is vice-chair of the Radiation Protection Association of the German Physical Society.
